

Code Committee Update December 2024

New Topic(s):

ASHRAE 43P, Operations Guideline for Ventilation of Health Care Facilities – 3<sup>rd</sup> Independent Substantive Change Public Review Draft

ASHRAE 43P is a new Guideline, currently in its 3rd public review during the month of November, 2024. It is neither a Standard, nor intended to be the basis for a Code. It is intended to provide guidelines to Healthcare Facilities on the proper operations of their HVAC systems and equipment in order to comply (and stay in compliance) with ASHRAE Standard 170. The comment period will close on January 6<sup>th</sup> 2025. Also Addendum M in ASHRAE 170 is also open for comments and that will close on January 27<sup>th</sup> 2025.
