





NFPA Codes: 101 and 99 – 2024 Editions


- Final editions are published.
- No updates on AHJ (CMS, DHS or AO) adoption.
- NFPA codes and standards were open for public comment for the 2026 revision cycle. This includes NFPA 101 and 99 and numerous other standards. The deadline was 6/4/24.

CMS Option: QSO-23-11-LSC Categorical Waiver – Health Care Microgrid Systems

- NFPA 99 2012 requires EP for an EES to be supplied by a generator or battery system.
- NFPA 99 2021 permits EP for an EES to be supplied by sources other than a generator or battery system, including a health care microgrid system (HCMS: clean energy technologies e.g., fuel cells, solar, wind, energy storage, etc.)
- The categorical waiver excludes long-term care (LTC) facilities that provide life support


